CHRISTCHURCH CALL

The Christchurch Call arose out of the livestreaming of a horrific terrorist event; In 2019, 51 Muslims were killed during prayer in Christchurch, Aotearoa New Zealand. After this event, the governments of Aotearoa New Zealand and France formed the Christchurch Call. The Christchurch Call is a community and series of commitments made by over 120 governments, online service providers, and civil society organisations acting together to **eliminate terrorist and violent extremist content online**.

The Christchurch Call Advisory Network (CCAN) is the civil society arm of the Christchurch Call. Members are organisations, academic departments, and experts representing a range of perspectives on topics related to Call commitments such as internet governance, digital rights and freedoms, and human rights. CCAN also warmly welcomes representatives of communities most impacted by terrorist and violent extremist activities and online content.

The Christchurch Call Advisory Network provides their expertise, advice, and skills to the Call community to combat the ongoing danger of terrorist and violent extremist content online.
